That will hopefully be in place by the end of November in shadow form so we can test it and modify it as necessary. How "place" will operate and work with the ICS will evolve from April 1st and will take time but the work we are doing now and the conversations we are having at the moment are encouraging.

Question is we have already waited 3/4 years for the white paper & now we are being told it could take another 3 years to bring this together ... would like to know if this could be delivered quicker	We are moving quicker than most at the local or "place" level. Our history has helped significantly. I don't think we can go any quicker, locally. The larger ICS is of course a different question. In view of the challenges i talked about, the push from the NHS and Local Government across the entire Humber, Coast and Vale geography should be focused on progress as quickly as possible - that's a personal view of course, there are many other stakeholders involved.
Does NELC know what budget cuts will impact our local area over the next 3 years? but great work taking place in terms of being far more efficient and smarter, however will central Government expect us to keep managing bigger and better services year on year with less money, that's the downside I feel and could work against us?	live answered The Spending Review will likely be announced by the Chancellor at or by the end of October. Unless or until we know what level of financial settlement Local Government will receive, it would be premature to speculate on what changes would have to be made locally. In any event, the Council will have to set its Budget by the end of February 2022 and that budget process will progress after the Spending Review. There are other bigger agendas like devolution that and so called "Levelling Up" that are taking a central role in Govt thinking - they may not present funding opportunities but not for services. Devolution etc may present funding opportunities but not revenue funding for services
